From the desk of the Mayor...



It's hard to believe that four years have gone by since you elected me as your Mayor. We've faced a lot of challenges and accomplished quite a bit the last four years. I want to thank everyone for their part in moving Fox Lake Forward and ask for everyone's help in the future.

Homelessness, mental illness and substance abuse are problems in every community. To think that it is not a problem in Fox Lake is irresponsible. We wish to be proactive in this regard, provide help to those who are willing to be helped, and keep our community safe.

We have established a Community Leaders Forum. The sole purpose of this group is to provide help to those looking for help with homelessness, substance abuse and other issues. The group is comprised of the Village, business leaders, PADS, NICASA, various Lake County offices, Grant Township, local churches and Veterans Assistance. The group is growing and other agencies are becoming involved. We are willing to offer help to any individual that is willing to be helped.

Our businesses and residents have the right to be safe and feel safe in our homes and places of business. It is illegal to consume alcohol in public, to possess illegal drugs or paraphernalia, to act in a manner that violates the Village Disorderly Conduct Ordinance, or to panhandle aggressively. The Village of Fox Lake will not condone or allow illegal activity. I have asked the Police Department to increase their efforts in curtailing illegal activity in our downtown, parks, bike paths and surrounding areas. We are budgeting for additional officers to accomplish this goal. This doesn't mean that we are reducing our Police protection in other areas.

Your Village and Police Department are going to need your help. If you see any of these activities occurring, please call the Police. I'm going to ask for your patience. The Police will respond to each call as quickly as possible. They must prioritize the importance of the calls they receive. For instance if they receive calls for an accident or domestic violence at the same time as an open alcohol call, they must respond to the most serious calls first. This doesn't mean they ignored the open alcohol call, it means that they were unable to respond at that particular time. This won't happen every time you call, so please call every time you see illegal activity.

When you call, be willing to "get involved." By giving a full description of the illegal or suspicious activity you will assist the officers in their investigation. If you provide a phone number, the police can contact you to obtain additional information when they arrive or report their findings back to you. Please call every time you see illegal activity. If a particular area receives multiple calls, this will help the Police Department determine which areas need additional attention.

If a person is disruptive at a place of business or apartment building, call the Police. This disruptive person can be banned from entering the premises. If the individual returns, they can be arrested for trespassing. Several businesses and apartment buildings have used this method to stop unwanted or illegal activity. Please help us make our town as safe as possible.

In each newsletter, we will be honoring volunteers who make a difference in our community. Last quarter, we honored Promote Fox Lake. We are going to call this the Anchor Community Service Award. This quarter, we are honoring the Grant Township Area Athletic Association. Please read the article about this remarkable group.

History of GTAAA

Let's start off with a bit of history from Larry Lutz, past GTAAA President. Back in the early 1960's Veteran's Park was actually known as Deer Haven Park. There was a petting zoo on the location where our fields now stand. Eventually the business closed and the lot sat empty.

Around 1970, Grant Township Little League, came together with Grant Township, Village of Fox Lake, and GTLL volunteers organized to create a new park. After a lot of work, the volunteers turned the space into a ball field; the beginning of Veteran's Park. The Boys' Majors and Softball fields were completed by the mid 1970's. Later, in the late 1990's a T-Ball field was added.

In 1972, the Village of Fox Lake Mayor and GTLL President agreed the organization could have access and utilize the fields as long as they were maintained. This partnership is long standing - lasting over forty years.

Present

Did you know that GTAAA is a private, non-profit organization, incorporated in the State of Illinois? GTAAA receives no tax dollars or financial support from area park districts. Each year GTAAA seeks sponsors in the community and surrounding areas and holds fundraising projects to help meet budgetary constraints. GTAAA is solely run and operated by many dedicated volunteers consisting of 12 Board Members and 40 coaches.

GTAAA offers many baseball and softball opportunities for the youth within the community of Fox Lake, serving around five-hundred players. In the spring, GTAAA offers co-ed Rising Stars (T-ball: 4 years old), co-ed Rookies (coach pitched for five and six year-olds), boys baseball ages seven to fourteen, and girls softball ages seven to eighteen. In the Winter months, GTAAA offers clinics to help our players prepare for the spring ball season. GTAAA also offers Fall ball season for boys baseball and girls softball.

UPDATED CODES

The Village adopts building codes that are developed by the International Code Council (ICC). ICC updates their code books every three years, but municipalities will skip a code cycle if the newest version doesn't have a major impact on construction methods.

LAKEFRONT PARK UPDATE

Lakefront Park construction is underway!

As shown in the picture to the right, drywall and insulation have been removed to allow for framing of new offices and classrooms.

Contractors have been in and out of the building over the last few months making great progress thus far. The project is on schedule to be completed by late June. Here are a few updates:

- Splash pad parts have been finalized and ordered;

- Plumbing for the bathrooms is in the process of being updated, new fixtures and tile have been ordered;
- Siding removal has begun, and will be replaced.

HOLIDAY LIGHTING REMOVAL

Is your holiday lighting still up?

The Village Code requires holiday lighting to be removed by January 15th, but typically extend that date to the end of February because of weather conditions.

It's important to remember that holiday lighting is manufactured as temporary lighting and the sun's UV rays and the outdoor elements can cause the plastic sheathing to become brittle and unsafe.

Inspect your holiday lights when you take them down and before you install them the following year. If you notice any damage, please discard them and purchase new lighting. When in doubt, throw them out!



SPRING AND SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

With Spring arriving, and the end of school around the corner, the Village of Fox Lake Police Department would like to remind drivers and bikers to be alert. Below are a few tips for safe biking (adults and children), and summer road safety for drivers and parents. KIDS & BIKE SAFETY

Bicycle riding is fun, healthy, and a great way for kids to be independent. However, it is important to remember that a bicycle is not a toy, it's a vehicle. Here are a few safety tips for kids and parents to promote safe riding:

- Check your equipment. Before riding, inflate tires properly and check that your brakes work.
- Wear a properly fitted bicycle helmet. Protect your brain, save your life
- Adjust your bicycle to fit.
- See and be seen. **Always** wear neon, fluorescent, or other bright colors when riding at day or night.
- Be on the lookout for hazards such as potholes, broken glass, gravel, puddles, leaves, and dogs.
- Avoid riding at night. If you have to ride at night, wear something that makes you more easily seen by others, and use a bike light.
- Follow the rules of the road.



SUMMER SAFETY

Soon school will be out for the summer! The Village of Fox Lake Police Department wants to remind drivers and parents about the importance of keeping children safe throughout the summer months.

TIPS FOR DRIVERS:

- Be alert, especially in residential areas.
- Expect the unexpected. Children may cross the street at the wrong place or suddenly run or ride in front of you.
- Double check behind you and around you when backing out of a driveway or parking space.
- Don't be distracted.
- Yield the right of way to pedestrians - it's the law.

TIPS FOR PARENTS:

- Focus on the basics. Teach your children to make eye contact with the driver before they cross, even if the walk signal is on.
- Remind them to walk, don't run across the road.
- Teach children to stop, look, and listen before crossing the street.
- Remind children not to play in or around vehicles.

RULES OF THE ROAD

Bicycles in many states are considered vehicles, and cyclists have the same rights and the same responsibilities to follow as motorists do. When riding always:

- Go with the traffic flow. Ride on the right in the same direction as other vehicles.
- Obey all traffic laws. When you ride in the street, obey all traffic signals, and lane markings.
- Be predictable. Ride in a straight line, not in and out of cars. Signal your intentions to others.
- Stay alert at all times. Use your eyes and ears. Watch out for potholes, cracks, wet leaves, storm grates, railroad tracks, or anything that could make you lose control of your bike.
- Watch for parked cars. Ride far enough out from the curb to avoid the unexpected from parked cars (like doors opening, or cars pulling out).



SPRING FLOODING

STORM DRAINS & FLOOD PREVENTION

With spring upon us, the potential for flooding increases. Village residents can take some simple steps to help reduce the risk and impact of flooding on their property, starting with our storm sewer system - most of which is under ground and out of sight. However, there is a visible component - the storm drain, that makes the storm sewer system work.

What are storm drains? These are the grates or culverts you see on a street corner and they allow water to drain from Village streets. These drains are the entryway to the Village's storm water system. They are especially important during storms when the high volume of falling water or melting snow will otherwise cause flooding. On rainy days, rainwater and anything else on the streets can enter storm drains. Storm drains typically have grids to prevent large objects from falling into the sewer system. However, the bars are spaced apart so the flow of water is not blocked. Consequently, many objects can fall through. If these basins get clogged with items such as leaves and other debris, water cannot be drained from the street.

The Village needs your help operating this system. By keeping debris off of your storm sewer grate, you can help keep water flowing, and decrease the likelihood of flooding. Do not attempt to remove the grate, only the debris on top of the grate. When the forecast calls for heavy rainfall or snow and ice, remove debris from the catch basin before a storm. After a storm, maintain drainage by clearing away any snow or ice.

PREPARING FOR A POTENTIAL FLOOD

The Village of Fox Lake Emergency Services staff is watching out for heavy rains, severe weather, and rapid snowmelt that can increase the risk of flooding. FoxComm encourages families and businesses to take action before the conditions present themselves.

The time to prepare is now.

Visit ready.gov/floods for information on family preparedness for flood and other emergencies. There are a number of steps individuals and families can take to better prepare themselves for flooding and reduce their risks.

Remember to have a family evacuation plan, put an emergency kit together, and keep important papers and valuables in a safe, dry place. Gather supplies in case of a storm, strengthen your home against damage, and review your insurance coverage.

IF A FLOOD OCCURS

During A Flood

- Go to higher ground. Get out of areas subject to flooding, including dips, low spots, washes, etc.;
- Avoid areas already flooded, especially when water flows fast. Do not attempt to cross flowing streams;
- Never drive through flooded roadways. Roadbeds may be washed out under flood waters.

After A Flood

- Check for structural damage before re-entering your home. If you suspect damage to water, gas, electric, or sewer lines, contact authorities;
- Remove wet contents immediately;
- Clean and disinfect everything touched by floodwaters;
- Plan before you repair. Contact your building department to get information on local building requirements.

HYDRANT FLUSHING

Beginning the week of April 7th and finishing on or about October 30th, the Fox Lake Sewer and Water Department will flush all fire hydrants in our Water Systems. This is to ensure they are in good working order in case of emergencies and to help flush sediment out of the distribution system.

Signs will be posted in each area before flushing begins. Flushing will be done between 7:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Monday through Saturday.

Please do not do laundry on the day hydrants are flushed in your area. Flushing stirs up rust and you don't want that in your washer. If there is discoloration in your faucet water after hydrant flushing is completed, let it run for a few minutes, preferably from the tub spout and it will clear up. The water is safe to drink.

WATER AUDITS

As a service to our residents, the Village of Fox Lake Sewer and Water Department offers free water audits, if requested.

A member of the Fox Lake Sewer and Water Staff will come to your location and check for:

1. Leaks
2. Fixture and meter efficiency
3. Offer conservation and water saving tips

EVALUATING PESTICIDE RISK

Many people believe that some pesticides are safe, while others are dangerous. Actually, the words "safe" and "dangerous" are misleading. Any chemical, including any pesticide, can pose risks to people, pets, or the environment. Understanding pesticide risks will help you take steps to minimize it.

The risk of a pesticide depends on two things, exposure (**how much?**) and toxicity (**how poisonous?**)

The **exposure** is the amount you get in or on your body, or the amount that is released into the environment. The **toxicity** of a pesticide is a measure of how poisonous it is to people or the environment.

Even products that are low in toxicity can be hazardous if the exposure is high enough. This is the basis for the argument that, "the dose makes the poison."

For example, one aspirin is beneficial for pain or certain medical conditions, but too much aspirin could be very hazardous. As the amount of exposure (the dose) increases, so does the risk.

Pesticides often contain more than one ingredient, and each one may have a different toxicity. One easy way to estimate the toxicity of a pesticide product is to look at the signal word.

Most pesticides will have either the word **CAUTION**, **WARNING**, or **DANGER** on the label, and that signal word reflects the toxicity of the product:

CAUTION: represents the lower toxicity products

WARNING: indicates medium toxicity products

DANGER: stands for the highest toxicity products

During this gardening season, stay safe and know your labels!

YOU DIDN'T REALLY WIN THE LOTTERY...

Recently, Fox Lake Police as well as other law enforcement agencies have received reports of citizens losing large amounts of money as a result of "winning the lottery". Many are foreign lotteries from areas such as Canada or Jamaica, even though the "winner" has never played a foreign lottery.

How does a lottery scam work?

Victims are notified they have won a lottery, requesting to pay transfer fees, taxes or provide proof of their identity and/or details of their bank accounts or credit cards in order to receive the "winnings". The names of these organizations change all the time, although many of the notifications use similar wording.

Here are tips for avoiding lottery scams:

- You cannot win a legitimate lottery if you have not entered it;
- In almost all cases you must purchase a ticket to enter a legitimate lottery;
- You never have to pay to collect winnings from a legitimate lottery. You pay taxes after you receive the winnings. There are no other fees;
- If you hold a winning lottery ticket, you notify the lottery (they do not notify you);
- It is illegal under U.S. federal law to play any foreign lottery from the United States;
- If you do not see the lottery on a list of legitimate lotteries provided by a reputable organization such as the Consumer Fraud Reporting Organization, or the Federal Trade Commission, it is probably a scam;
- If it isn't conducted by a government or government - authorized charitable organization, it can't be a legitimate lottery.

If you believe you have been the victim of a crime, contact your local police, State Attorney or the Attorney General's Office.

HOUSEHOLD CHEMICAL WASTE COLLECTION EVENT

SATURDAY, APRIL 29, 2017

8:00 A.M. - 2:30 P.M.

SWALCO, the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County will be holding a household chemical waste collection event on Saturday, April 29, 2017 at the Village of Fox Lake Street Department - 216 Washington Avenue. The event will be from 8:00 a.m until 2:30 p.m.

The following materials will be accepted: Aerosol products, antifreeze & motor oil, fertilizers/herbicides/pesticides, florescent light bulbs/CFLs, furniture stripper and varnishes, gasoline & kerosene, household batteries (lithium & rechargeable only), household cleaners, oil-based paints and paint removers, prescription and over-the-counter medicines and supplements (human & pet)

The following material is will not be accepted: Latex paint, DEA controlled substances, business wastes, farm chemicals, propane tanks, lead-acid and alkaline batteries, explosives, medical wastes, construction/demolition debris, fire extinguishes, smoke detectors, and household electronics.

SWALCO also offers year-round household chemical waste public drop off events at their Gurnee, IL facility by appointment only on the second Saturday and fourth Monday of every month. SPRING UPDATES FROM THE STREET DEPARTMENT

This coming spring, the Village of Fox Lake Street Department will be sweeping every street in the Village. Streets with curbs and storm sewers will be prioritized, as sweeping these particular streets helps minimise infiltration into the storm sewer system.

The Street Departments asks that residents refrain from raking debris or grass clippings onto the street to ensure storm sewers and ditches function properly. Through the course of spring and early summer, the Street and Water Departments will be cleaning and inspecting storm sewer catch basins to ensure their effectiveness and efficiency.

BRUSH PICKUP TO RESUME

The Street Department will resume brush pickup. As reminder, the size of brush piles is limited. Branches cannot exceed six (6) inches in diameter or ten (10) feet in length. Piles should be stacked with the cut ends facing the street. Piles should not exceed ten (10) feet wide by ten (10) feet deep and four (4) feet high. If the pile exceeds these restrictions, it will not be picked up.

This service is for branches, not whole trees. Additionally, yard and garden waste will not be collected. The Street Department thanks you in advance for your cooperation!
