From the desk of the Mayor...



As I begin my 2nd term as your Mayor, I am proud of what we were able to accomplish as a community these past four years. While we have made great progress, there is still much to do. The Village Board and Staff have been working very hard to make our town resident and business friendly and provide essential services.

Transparency has always been one of my goals. The same Village Board packet for Village Board meetings that the Trustees receive is always published the Friday afternoon before meetings. Please look at these packets and attend the Village Board meetings. We'll be happy to answer any questions or concerns that you might have. The annual town hall meeting will be held in September at the High School again.

As you will read in this newsletter, there are more activities and programs for our residents than there have ever been. 80% of the Lakefront Park construction was done through a grant. This is just one example of how our staff is able to provide for our residents.

We continue to improve our sewer and water systems. The water tower on Grass Lake Road will be operational soon. Construction of the Holiday Park water tower was completed and solved the water hammer problem in the South system and resulted in an upgrade in our insurance rating.

We have applied for and received over four million dollars in grants for our streets. Phase 1 of Sayton Road from Walgreen's to Industrial Road will begin in the Spring of 2018. Phase 1 will include a lighted bike path connecting the Lake County Bike path on Rollins Road to the proposed hotel on Route 12. Phase 2 from Industrial Road to Route 12 will be done in 2019. Other road projects are Grand Avenue, from Rollins Road to Route 59 in 2019-2020 and Nippersink Road from Oak Street to Grand Avenue in 2020-2021. In addition to these projects, we will be repairing our neighborhood streets as quickly as we can.

History of the American Legion Family

Members of The American Legion, The American Legion Women's Auxiliary, The Sons of the American Legion, and The American Legion Riders comprise the American Legion Family, which has a combined membership of nearly 4.2 million worldwide. The American Legion is a wartime veterans' organization that was chartered by Congress in 1919. The Legion Auxiliary and the Sons of the American Legion exist to honor the service and sacrifice of Legionnaires and were founded in 1919 and 1932 respectively. They are also home to the Legion Riders motorcycle group. This band of enthusiasts is comprised of all three branches of the family.

The Legion Family has been a part of the Fox Lake community since 1936 when the property on Nippersink Lake was purchased and Post 703 was chartered. The existing boat building facility was located on the grounds prior to 1920 when the railroad was extended over the water to points north. The ramps and support beams for hoisting the newly built boats can still be seen as part of our building. The banquet room and bar have always been an important meeting place of the movers and shakers of the area. The facility is open to the public most every day and hosts Bingo on Thursday and other activities in the large ballroom all year-round.

The American Legion Family supports our Veterans and their families by being a powerful voice in Washington DC, advocating for benefits and better care at all V.A. facilities. Millions of hours and many more dollars are spent on programs started by the Legion. The American Heart Association and Child Welfare Network are two prime examples.

Local Community Involvement

On a local level, high school scholarships are awarded each year through Americanism and Oratorical contests. Legacy funds for the children of Fallen Servicemen and women are an important cause of the Legion Riders. Boy's State and Girl's State, are programs open to high school students entering their senior year to help teach the history and workings of our nation's government. It was the American Legion who stepped in to help the Boy Scouts when political correctness threatened to end the organization. Respect for our flag and the saying of our National Anthem in schools are important principles of our membership.

Additionally American Legion Baseball, a huge part of Americana, is played all over the country and is a major starting point for many major league players. Our own district team, mostly from Grant HS, brought home a second place trophy last year in the State Championship.

On July 15 2017, the Sons of the American Legion are inviting the residents of Fox Lake and surrounding areas to a Community Festival on the grounds of Post 703. NEWS FROM COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

RESIDENTIAL RENTAL REGISTRATION PROGRAM

Fox Lake has a residential rental certification program that requires landlords to register their rental property with the Village of Fox Lake. Additionally it is required that the rental property be inspected and certified before landlords can rent the dwelling to tenants.

When the inspector inspects the property, they are looking for life safety issues such as: proper installation of smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, balcony/porch/deck safety, properly operating windows, HVAC system health and several other items.

The Community Development Department Inspection staff works closely with property owners to educate landlords on life safety issues, and to ensure their units are certified.

If you are a tenant, you may contact the Community Development Department to determine if your rental unit is certified. Additionally, if you have any concerns about the potential unsafe condition of the property from which you are renting, please call the Community Development Department at the contact information listed below.

If you are a landlord and were not aware that you have to have your rental inspected and certified, please give the Village a call to schedule an inspection, so the Community Development Department staff can assist in bringing your property into compliance.

DISTRACTED DRIVING AWARENESS

You probably know that texting while driving isn't safe, and is illegal. What you may not be aware is that distracted driving in its many forms, is one of the greatest threats to driver safety according to public health experts. When drivers engage in distracting activities such as crying, reaching for objects, and interacting with others in the car - the risk for crashing is more than doubled.

The Village of Fox Lake Police Department would like to remind drivers and passengers that distracted driving can be avoided, especially for those that are new to driving. Here are a few tips to avoid distracted driving:

- **Stay away from your cell phone:** While you are driving, a cell phone should never be utilized as it is illegal in the State of Illinois. If you need to make a call, it is best to pull over safely to the right shoulder of the road. Even hands-free devices can still cause you to miss important visual and audio cues needed to avoid a crash.
- **If you are drowsy, pull off the road:** Drowsiness increases the risk of a crash by merely four times. A government study showed that 37 percent of U.S. drivers have nodded off or actually fallen asleep at least once during their driving careers.
- **Limit the number of passengers, as well as the level of activity inside the car:** Especially for teenage drivers, limit the number of passengers within vehicles. Driving with friends can create a dangerous driving environment because novice drivers are focused on their friends rather than the road. Have a discussion with your new driver about limiting distractions.
- **Avoid eating while driving:** Food spills are a major cause of distraction and distracted driving. Decrease your risk of accident by not eating while driving.
- **Do your multi-tasking outside the car:** Everyone spends a lot of time in their vehicles, and it is important to focus on the road and the drivers around you. Prior to traveling, get everything settled to decrease your chance of distraction.

Drivers who are distracted and fail to focus their full attention on the road are the leading cause of most crashes according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Keep yourselves and others safe by remaining alert, and free of distractions.

SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

The Department of Homeland Security and the Village of Fox Lake Police Department are reminding residents to "see something, say something."

If you see illegal or suspicious activity, please report to the Village of Fox Lake Police Department directly. As a reminder, do not report suspicious activity through websites, or email as they are not as frequently monitored as emergency phone lines.

To report suspicious activity, contact the Village of Fox Lake Police Department by calling 9-1-1. To assist local officers, describe specifically what you observed including:

- **Who** or **what** you saw;
- **When** you saw it;
- **Where** it occurred; and
- **Why** it's suspicious.

WATER DEPARTMENT UPDATES

SUMMER WATER SAVING TIPS

Summer can increase a typical family's freshwater use by almost 100%.

Here are several tips to reduce your summer water use for lawn and garden maintenance:

- **Irrigate at night:** Watering your lawn at night or during the early morning hours can reduce evaporation up to 30 percent or more, depending on your location.
- **Avoid High Wind Watering:** High winds can evaporate water or blow it away from the target zone; this lowers your sprinkler's efficiency and wastes water.
- **Don't Over water Your Lawn:** Your yard only needs about an inch of water per week to stay healthy, established gardens require a little less. Watering infrequently but deeply will inhibit a deep root growth, keeping your lawn viable for years to come. Over watering has been linked to pesticide and fertilizers being introduced into streams and rivers so avoidance is the best practice all around.
- **Use Rain Barrels:** Capture the naturally occurring rain and store it for use in your garden or yard. Many systems can be hooked right up to your sprinklers using solar or traditional powered pumps.
- **Don't Water the Street:** Thousands of gallons of water are wasted each day in neighborhoods and homes that have improperly setup sprinkler heads. The street and sidewalk don't need watering, take special care to make sure your sprinkler heads and hoses put the water where it is really needed.

This data base is only seen by law enforcement or emergency responders and is entered and modified by you, the identification holder. It is not public record.
