From the desk of the Mayor...



It's hard to believe that summer is nearly over. But as summer ends, we look forward to the fall, one of the most beautiful times in our Village.

This July, we experienced another record flood. This was the worst flood in history and is the 2nd record breaking flood in four years. Once again, the Village of Fox Lake showed what a truly great community we are. We thank all the volunteers, our staff and all the communities that gave

us assistance. Neighbor helped neighbor, strangers became friends and together, we made the best of a horrible situation.

Congressmen Brad Schneider and Randy Hultgren, along with Governor Bruce Raunier, and our staff, are working hard to see that our Village government and residents can get help to offset our uninsured losses.

Unfortunately, the cost to the Village general fund related to the flood was almost \$400,000. In addition to the cost to the Village, during the flood, our treatment plant ran around the clock for 11 days. This resulted in 500 hours of overtime and there was about \$300,000 in damage to the plant. The treatment plant is owned and operated by the Village, but is part of the enterprise fund, which is separate from the general fund. So as you can see, the flood was quite costly to the Village.

The State has passed a budget. While the State has increased the state income tax to individuals, it has decreased its payments to municipalities. The State is also charging a 2.0% Sales Tax collection fee to municipalities. These two reductions from the State total over \$200,000. The losses of revenue from the State, coupled with the uninsured costs from the flood have forced us to delay or postpone several projects. But as always, we will make adjustments and move forward.

LEAF BURNING REMINDER

Leaves may be burned on private property between the period of April 1 to June 1 and September 1 to December 1, of each and every year.

Burning of leaves must be at least 30' from any structure. Please have a garden hose or other means to extinguish the fire within close proximity.

As a courtesy to your neighbors, only burn leaves on days when the wind won't affect neighboring properties.

A better solution for fall leaves is to shred them and use them as mulch around your garden beds and trees. They decompose into rich and natural fertilizer for your gardens and trees and worms love shredded leaves!

BACK TO SCHOOL DRIVING TIPS

School days bring congestion: Yellow school buses are picking up their passengers, kids on bikes are hurrying to get to school before the bell rings, parents are trying to drop their kids off before work. It's never more important for drivers to slow down and pay attention when kids are present – especially before and after school.

The Village of Fox Lake Police Department would like to remind drivers of school congestion and offer a few tips on how to share the road:

- **Share the Road with Young Pedestrians:** Take extra care to look out for children in school zones, near playgrounds and parks, and in all residential areas. In a school zone when flashers are blinking, stop and yield to pedestrians crossing the crosswalk or intersection.
- **Share the Road with School Buses:** If you're driving behind a bus, allow a greater following distance than if you were driving behind a car. It will give you more time to stop once the yellow lights start flashing. The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough back to allow them space to safely enter and exit the bus.
- **Share the Road with Bicyclists:** Children riding bikes create special problems for drivers because usually they are not able to properly determine traffic conditions. Be extra vigilant in school zones and residential neighborhoods and check side mirrors before opening your door.

FLYING A DRONE SAFELY AND LEGALLY

As drones become more popular, it is important to remember to follow the law and FAA regulations to fly your drone safely. The FAA has established rules for flying a drone under two basic categories, recreationally and commercially. This article will address the recreational use of drones.

If you intend to fly a drone recreationally, you can fly under what's called the "Special Rule for Model Aircraft." Under this rule, the operator must follow the adhere to the following rules, as taken from the FAA website:

1. Fly for hobby or recreational purposes only
2. Follow a community-based set of safety guidelines
3. Fly the UAS within visual line-of-sight
4. Give way to manned aircraft
5. Provide prior notification to the airport and air traffic control tower, if one is present, when flying within 5 miles of an airport
6. Fly UAS that weigh no more than 55 lbs. unless certified by a community-based organization

The community-based set of safety regulations contain a few more restrictions the operator needs to be aware of. An example of these regulations can be found within the Academy of Model Aeronautics National Model Aircraft Safety Code. A summary of the rules taken from within that code are as follows:

1. The drone must not be flown carelessly or recklessly.
2. The drone must be labeled with the owner's information.
3. The drone shall not be flown directly over unprotected people and vehicles.

The above is only a summary of the rules and laws regarding flying your drone safely and legally. Please refer to the FAA website for further explanation. If you intend to fly commercially, you will have to follow FAA Part 107 and become a licensed Small Unmanned Aircraft operator.

PREMISE ALERT PROGRAM

Fox Lake responders continuously strive to provide the best care for our citizens.

As such, the Village of Fox Lake participates in the state wide Premise Alert Program (PAP). The Premise Alert Program is a tool citizens can use to alert responders of special response needs that will aid our responders providing service. This system allows citizens to ensure responders are aware of special response needs and cautions that would aid in quick and safe responses; addressing your or your family's specific needs.

A Premise Alert form must be completed and is available on line at www.foxlake.org, or available by calling the non-emergency line at (847) 587-3100 and requesting the document to be picked up, faxed, e-mailed, or mailed. This form is only valid for one year from the date of filing and must be updated each year to maintain the records.
