From the desk of the Mayor...



With the (hopefully final) snowfall on April 19th, it appears that the winter of 2017-18 may be finally ending and at long last, Spring has arrived.

Five years ago, you elected me as your Mayor. Over the past five years, together, we have achieved many successes. I would like to share with you a few of our accomplishments.

Communication and transparency with our residents has been a focus of the Board. An annual town hall meeting is held, the same Village Board packets that the Board receives are available to you online every Friday afternoon before a Board meeting, so that you are as informed as possible on the current Village issues. Our website will be upgraded this August, and we now have a presence on social media.

We revived four discontinued programs. Our Pace handicapped/disadvantaged bus service averages about 300 riders per month. The façade improvement program gave \$30,000 in grants to businesses this year which has resulted in \$160,000 in façade improvements. The Citizen's Police Academy is conducting two sessions per year. Finally, Fox Lake in Bloom has been reinstated as Promote Fox Lake and their beautification efforts can be seen throughout the town.

Lakefront Park has been expanded and we now have more programs for our residents than ever. The long awaited Sayton Road reconstruction project will begin this summer and Nippersink Road along with the Lion's Club hill will be redone next year.

In the past year, Ray Dodge, Culvers, Studio Hotrods Road House, and Dunkin Donuts have invested twelve million dollars in Fox Lake on Route 12 alone. There is even more to come next year.

We have installed two water towers, one in the northern part of town and one in the southern part of town.

The southern tower solved the water hammer problem that was damaging hundreds of homes in the southern part of town, increased fire protection capacity and resulted in an upgrade in our insurance rating. The northern tower satisfied the EPA mandates, increased fire protection capacity and improved water pressure.

Five years ago, we were in danger of losing our FEMA flood insurance due to noncompliance with FEMA and IDNR. Now, Fox Lake is used in IDNR presentations as an example on how to comply, and our efforts will result in a reduction of flood insurance rates. The name of their presentation is "Worst to First, Fox Lake".

We have hired the most qualified people available and are paying competitive salaries, so we can retain our staff. We have hired additional Police personnel, and increased our downtown visibility.

We combined the Planning and Zoning Boards to be more efficient. Staff has streamlined permit processes for businesses and residents alike to provide for a more efficient, friendly experience when dealing with the Village.

When you enter our building, you will be greeted with a smile and asked "How can I help you?" While we have accomplished many things together, there is more to do and we will continue to work hard to make Fox Lake, the town we all love, even better.

ANCHOR AWARD

HONORING THOSE THAT SERVE THE COMMUNITY OF FOX LAKE

The Fox Lake Citizens Police Academy

The Anchor Award is a Quarterly Award presented to a local group or organization within our community. Organizations that receive the award will be presented with a plaque at a Village of Fox Lake Board Meeting and an article published in the Village Newsletter about the organization. Please contact Mayor Schmit at schmitd@foxlake.org if you know of an organization within Fox Lake that should receive this award. This quarter's Anchor Award goes to the Men and Women of the Fox Lake Police Department's Citizen Police Academy.

The idea of the Citizens Police Academy has been in existence since the late 1970's, and was developed in England as the "Police Night School". Over time the program was implemented in the United States in the early 1980's as the Citizens Police Academy. Although not an academy designed to train citizens to exercise law enforcement authority, the academy allows the public to learn about police administrative and operational functions, the organizational structure and chain of command, as well as building a strong partnership between the citizens and the women and men who serve the community.

The Fox Lake Citizen Police Academy Program has been in existence for several years but had been inactive. The program was recently revitalized at the request of the Mayor and Village Board. Chief Lee sought volunteers from officers within the police department to update the program, accept applications for participation, and schedule the classes and instructors. On January 10, 2018, the first Citizens Police Academy of 2018 began the 10 week program.

During the 10 weeks, classes were held on Wednesday evenings between 7 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. The citizen students received training related to the staff structure of the Village Government and Police Department, constitutional law, legal aspects of State and Village Statutes, patrol operations, traffic enforcement, crash investigations, crime preventions, investigation, 911 operations, as well as task force and law enforcement mutual aid agreements. Twelve citizens were selected to participate in this session.

The graduation ceremony was held on March 14, 2018. Over the ten weeks a strong relationship was developed between the participants and the officers. The citizens have committed to participating in other community/police events such as National Night Out, Halloween Howl and Shop with a Cop. In addition, based on our relationship the graduates can be additional eyes and ears in the community to report suspicious activity. They have and will "Make a Difference" in the community.



POLICE DEPARTMENT RECEIVES COMMAND BOX GRANT

Recently the Fox Lake Police Department applied for and was awarded a grant to purchase and install Command Boxes in the rear of three vehicles. The grant was offered through the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus and Commonwealth Edison Company (ComEd). The Command Boxes allow the department command staff to respond to events and have the necessary equipment to manage serious events from a Forward Command Post.

The Command Boxes provide secure storage for tactical equipment used at scenes of hazardous situations such as natural disasters, hazardous tactical situations, major traffic crash investigations and community events. The Command Boxes also have a self-contained "Command Board" to graphically display vital information utilized to successfully track the location of personnel, equipment and other assets. This type of equipment is vital in mitigating emergencies during multi-jurisdictional police activities. The availability of such equipment supports public safety functions when operating in the nationally recognized Incident Command System.

These boxes are built into four public safety vehicles that are ready to display maps, deploy staff to their assigned locations, and help to minimize the chaos and delays that often accompany the initial response to a major incident. With this new purchase Commanders are able to focus on critical decision-making rather than trying to figure out how to direct their resources effectively.



A command vehicle that is equipped with these boxes also provides a stable, single point of coordination for public safety responders. This helps reduce confusion, duplication of efforts, and other pitfalls commonly associated with large scale emergencies as well as small community events which the Village hosts throughout the year. The vehicles equipped with this inventory will also be available to other communities through our long standing mutual aid agreements.

The total cost of obtaining the Command Boxes was \$9,839.74. Through the grant, the Police Department split the cost for the purchase of the Command Boxes with the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus / ComEd; Powering Safe Communities Municipal Grant Program. The Village of Fox Lake will receive a reimbursement in the amount of \$4,551.40 from the Grant award. The Village of Fox Lake has matched this grant with the remaining cost for the project, which was \$5,288.34.

When lives are at stake, police and other emergency personnel must be able to track resources when making command and control decisions and effectively communicate operational directives to coordinate emergency responses. The Command Boards greatly enhance an Incident Commander's ability to gather information during critical events.

The grant was awarded through a program dedicated to advancing public safety initiatives throughout Illinois. Twenty-five municipalities were awarded funds through the grant program as part of the initiative.

BICYCLE SAFETY

With warmer weather approaching, the Fox Lake Police Department has provided some tips for bicycle safety.

As required by the Illinois Vehicle Code, bicycles traveling on the roadway are vehicles and have all of the rights and responsibilities as motor vehicles. Bicycles are required to drive in the same direction as traffic. Bicyclists are expected to ride single file and to the far right of the roadway except when turning left they may use the left lane. When a bicyclist is continuing forward at intersections with a right turn lane then bicyclist should continue in the through lane.

When driving in the roadway, bicyclists are required to obey street signs and signals and must signal their turns, lane changes, and stops. Bicycles may not be used to carry more passengers than it was designed to transport. Bicyclist must have one hand on the handlebars at all times and should not carry any items that would prevent them from using both hands.

At night, bicycles are required to have at a minimum a front headlight and a rear reflector. Contrasting and reflective clothing is preferred when riding at night for added visibility.

Motor vehicle operators must yield to bicycles as they would any other car on the roadway. In addition, when passing a bicycle, a motorist must provide at least 3 feet between the vehicle and bicycle. If a bicycle is maintaining the speed limit motorist should not pass the bicycle. When passing, the vehicle should slow down, pass on the left and again provide at least 3 feet gap between the two. If they cannot allow at least 3 feet between the bicycle and motor vehicle, they should not pass.

A younger cyclists may use the sidewalk or pathway. When riding on the sidewalk, bicyclists are treated as pedestrians and are given the same expectations. Bicycles approaching walking pedestrians should call out to the walkers, advise their intention to pass, and when safe to do so, pass the walkers on the left.

Additional safety precautions to consider include ensuring the bicycle is a proper fit for the rider, and the rider has a properly fitted helmet that is correctly secured. Wearing bright clothing during the day and contrasting/reflective clothing at night will allow for riders to be seen more easily by the motorists sharing the roadway.

BRUSH PICKUP TO RESUME

The Public Works Department - Street Division is resuming brush pickup.

As A reminder, the size of brush piles is limited. Branches cannot exceed six (6) inches in diameter or ten (10) feet in length. Piles should be stacked with the cut ends facing the street. Piles should not exceed ten (10) feet wide by ten (10) feet deep and four (4) feet high. If the pile exceeds these restrictions, it will NOT be picked up.

This service is for branches, not whole trees. Additionally, yard and garden waste will not be collected.

CHANGE TO VILLAGE VEHICLE LICENSE FEE PROGRAM

Home or business owners will no longer have to make a special trip to the Village Hall to pay for vehicle license fees, or display vehicle stickers on their vehicles starting May 1, 2018. The Village has instituted a new vehicle license fee program where vehicle license fees of \$25.00 per household/business unit will be billed to you once annually on one of your bimonthly utility statements. This annual fee will cover all of the automobiles in your dwelling or commercial establishment, and in most cases, will result in a decrease to your vehicle fees annually.

If you receive a water, sewer, or refuse bill from the Village, look for the vehicle license fee charge to appear on your statement during May or June, depending on the month you usually receive these bills. Vehicle license fees that are not paid on time are subject to penalties and fines anywhere from \$25 - \$225, so prompt payment is encouraged.

SUMMER ROAD CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

In addition to road construction on Nippersink, several other road projects will be beginning this summer - Sayton Road, and a bridge enhancement on US Route 12 and US Route 59.

Sayton road reconstruction is anticipated to start in late May. One lane traffic is expected throughout the duration of the project, expect delays. The reconstruction is expected to last through November.

US Route 12 bridge over US Route 59 is estimated to start in May. The reconstruction of the bridge will entail significant detours, estimated completion of this project is late November 2018.

HELP KEEP OUR WATER CLEAN

The following are some tips to help prevent storm water pollution and protect our natural resources:

1. Do not dump anything down a storm drain. Always recycle used oil, antifreeze, and other fluids.
2. Wash your car at a commercial car wash rather than in the street or in your drive way.
3. Cut down on use of fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides. If you do use, don't fertilize before a rainstorm.
4. Keep pets out of streams and lakes. When outside clean up your pets waste and properly dispose of it.
5. Clear storm drains in front of your yard. Keeping storm drains clear helps to reduce flooding on roadways.

FOX LAKE GRADE SCHOOL DISTRICT 114 OFFERS PRE-SCHOOL SCREENING

Parents and Guardians of Fox Lake Grade School District 114 should be aware that pre-school screening is now available for children that have turned three on or before September 1, 2018.

If your child turned three on or before September 1st, 2018, Fox Lake Grade School District 114 will be offering a pre-school screening on May 9th and May 10th for the 2018 - 2019 school year.

The screening will provide parents/guardians with information regarding the child's development in the areas of pre-academic readiness, motor skills, speech and language skills, social and emotional learning, vision and hearing. Children identified through the screening process as "at risk" may qualify for preschool services and/or recommended for further evaluation.

A screening for newborns to three years of age will also be available for parents/guardians who have concerns regarding a child's early development.

The parent/guardian questionnaire for children 0-3 years of age is completed by the adult; the child does not need to be present for the screening.

Please note this is an at-risk grant program and not all students may qualify.
