From the desk of the Mayor...



Spring is finally here; even though we received six inches of snow on April 14, we look forward to the return of the pelicans, eagles and all the beauty that nature blesses us with.

This year, we will be completing Phase I of the Sayton Road project hopefully by mid-June, weather permitting. You will notice that part of the project includes a lighted bike path that connects from Walgreens to the Rollins

Road bike path. The Grand Avenue project, in addition to correcting the drainage problems at Highview, will be repaved this year from the railroad tracks to Rushmore. Staff was once again able to obtain grants for this work. In addition to the sewer and water interconnect project, Nippersink Boulevard will be repaved.

We have begun the planning for Phase II of Sayton Road reconstruction. Through the hard work of the Village staff, these projects are being done with grants from the State. For Sayton Road, the State pays 80% and the Village portion of the cost of the project is 20%. Our staff has been able to get over \$4 million dollars in grants for streets the past few years.

We will also be reconstructing the Frontage Road by Jewel and Menards this summer. This work is being paid for by funds from the Southern Business Development District (BDD). Plans are underway for reconstruction of the Frontage Road by the old Dominick's. This work will also be paid out of the BDD funds.

Washington Street is scheduled to be repaired by the County and is in the Phase II Engineering stage. This project will include a bike path from Grand Avenue to the Rollins Road bike path. The County has this project scheduled for 2021.

It seems as though winter has taken a greater toll on our roads this year than others. Our Public Works crews are out filling potholes constantly. Everywhere I go, I am asked "what are you going to do about the streets?"

FROM THE DESK OF THE MAYOR

CONTINUED...

In the past six years, since I became Mayor, we have paved several miles of roads in Eagle Point, Round Hill, Dunns Lake, Lotus Woods and other neighborhoods of the Village.

Here's what keeps me up at night. The Village owns and maintains over 55 miles of roads. We had a street assessment done several years ago where every street was rated from 1-10, with 1 being a street in the worst condition and 10 being a street in very good condition. More than 25% or about 16 miles of our streets were rated 1-4. The cost to repair a street is dependent on the condition of the road. Streets rated 1-3 cost about a million dollars per mile to repair, 4-7 cost about a half million dollars to repair and 8-10 costs about a quarter million dollars to fix and maintain. Just to repair the streets rated 1-4 would cost over \$16 million dollars.

So how do we determine what roads to fix and how to pay for them? There are a lot of factors in deciding which roads to do. If a road is rated as a one, the worst condition, but only has 20 cars a day traveling on it and a road is rated a 2 or 3, but has hundreds of cars traveling on it daily, which should be repaired first? If you are one of the 20 cars on the street in the worst condition, you're going to want your street fixed, if you're one of the hundreds that drive on the damaged, but slightly better street; you'll want that street repaired.

Once a decision is made on which street to repair is made, the next hurdle is paying for the repairs. The main sources of funds for the Village are property tax and sales tax. The Village receives about 8% of your total property tax. This amounts to about \$1.8 million dollars per year. If you pay \$10,000 in property tax, the Village receives \$800. Of the \$1.8 million dollars, \$735,000 is obligated to the Police Pension Fund, which leaves us about \$1.1 million dollars for all other Village expenses and projects. The Village receives around three million dollars from sales tax. By the way, slightly over one million dollars in sales tax comes from auto sales. From these two sources of money, the Village provides Police protection, 911 services, recreation activities, maintains the streets, snow plowing, grass cutting and all the other services that we provide.

Through careful management of funds, the Village has about \$18 million dollars in bonding capacity that it could borrow. The problem with borrowing money is that it has to be paid back. The more money that is borrowed, the higher the interest payment becomes. Bonds are usually for twenty years. We could borrow a lot of money and fix most of the worst streets, but at what cost for the future? I have to worry about future administrations and leave them the ability to be able to govern, meet their needs and take advantage of any opportunities that may arise.

So here is our plan for the streets. We have budgeted \$2 million dollars this year for street replacement and plan on budgeting at least the same amount for each of the next several years. We are going to update the street assessment of all Village owned roads. We will then come up with a reasonable street replacement program. The Governor and President have each promised that there will be a capital bill from Springfield and Washington this year. We have done the engineering for "shovel ready" projects, so that when the capital bill eventually occurs, we will be able to receive funds. Finally, if the capital bill does not come to pass, we will keep our residents informed of what we can accomplish.

This quarter we honor Bobby Boles and Butch and Melinda Conrad as Anchor Award winners for their many years of service to the Village as business owners, volunteers, and donors to our community.

This is an exciting time in the Village as new businesses, along with our established businesses are making investments in our community. Please patronize all our businesses as we continue to grow.

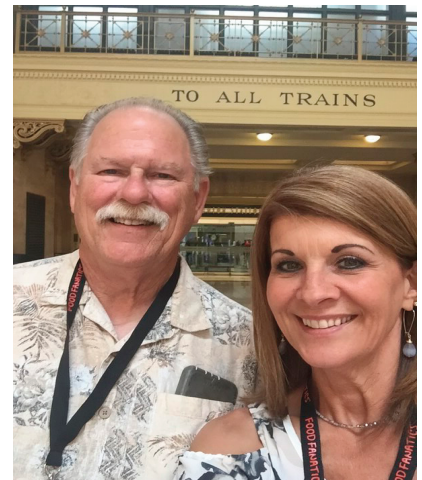
Melinda served on a number of steering committees including working with the Fox Lake Grade School to develop the district's mission statement. She also was a community voice for the Village's Strategic Plan.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

With all the road construction beginning around town please see an overview of projects below. Several projects in process and upcoming are Village related but not Village projects (IDOT, Metra). Ongoing and upcoming projects include:

NON-VILLAGE PROJECTS - IDOT

Bridge deck overlay and bridge joint repairs at two structures carrying US 12 over Nippersink Lake Channel and over Pistakee Lake Channel. Project includes but is not limited to:

- Combination concrete curb and gutter, type b-6.24 (special);
- Concrete gutter;
- Approach slab repair (full depth);
- Structural steel removal;
- Bridge deck latex concrete overlay, 2 1/2 inches;
- Bridge sidewalk repair (partial depth);
- Structural repair of concrete (depth equal to or less than 5 inches).

NON-VILLAGE PROJECTS - METRA

Metra platform at the Nippersink Train Station is in process of being redone with a time-frame for completion of four to six weeks. This two-phased project will consist of a rebuild of the train station platform. Remodel started on the West half of the platform (towards Oak) and will move East until completion. There should be no impact to the on-boarding and off-boarding of passengers.

The platform remodel will consist of the replacement of old broken brick with stamped asphalt. The stamped asphalt has a longer life span, is more aesthetically pleasing, and has been added to most Metra stations in the area.

Metra-Gates, Signals and Safety Crossing at Jefferson Street-Metra received approval of this project on April 1st along with a notice to proceed. The Village is working with Metra to get dates and schedules of this project and will keep residents informed when additional information is received.

VILLAGE PROJECTS - LOCAL ROADS / STP PROJECTS

Sayton Road construction commenced on Monday April 8, 2019 which includes closure of Sayton Road at Rollins on both sides of the railroad track. There will be no entering Sayton from Rollins for the duration of the project. They are hoping to be substantially complete by June 15th.

VILLAGE PROJECTS - FRONTAGE ROAD / HARTIGAN ROAD

The construction began on Monday April 29th and will consist of a total reconstruction of the road, curbs and drainage. We will keep you posted as to the schedules. It is not anticipated that any road closures will be needed.

VILLAGE PROJECTS - GRAND AVENUE RESURFACING

The Grand Avenue project went out to bid on April 26th. This project consists of removal and resurfacing of the asphalt from Nippersink Blvd. to Rushmore Road. As part of this project there will also be some spot repairs to sidewalks, and curbs and ADA updates along with some additional curbs to help define intersections in order to improve safety.

VILLAGE PROJECTS - GRAND AVENUE LIGHTING

The Grand Avenue Lighting project is in the final stages of engineering and is likely to go out to bid in the next few weeks. This project includes installing new decorative lighting throughout Grand Avenue including our downtown area, along West Grand Avenue, and east towards Route 59. The lighting project will help improve safety by lighting both the streets and the sidewalks lining Grand Avenue.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION UPDATE CONT.

VILLAGE PROJECTS - GRACE AVENUE CLOSURE / PUBLIC AREA

Grace Avenue Closure/Public Area - The Grace Avenue project will consist of permanently closing approximately 60 feet of Grace Avenue from Grand Avenue northbound. This area will be redeveloped into a public gathering area. The Village is in the final design of this project and hope to see it go out to bid in the next couple of months.

VILLAGE PROJECTS - NIPPERSINK BLVD.

Project will include resurfacing, new curb and gutter, stormwater infrastructure, a bike path, and reconstruction of the wall in front of the train station. The sewer portion of the project (known as the interconnect) has been put to BID. Staff will keep everyone informed as to the project timeline after the preconstruction meeting.

HOW TO STAY INFORMED

Updates will also be sent in the Village's weekly E-Newsletter - the E-Anchor. Finally, overall updates on infrastructure can also be found in the Village Board Packet which is published in full on the Village's website the Friday before the second and fourth Tuesday of every month.

DISTRACTED DRIVING AWARENESS

You probably know that texting while driving isn't safe, and is illegal. What you may not be aware of is that distracted driving in its many forms, is one of the greatest threats to driver safety according to public health experts. When drivers engage in distracting activities such as crying, reaching for objects, and interacting with others in the car - the risk for crashing is more than doubled.

The Village of Fox Lake Police Department would like to remind drivers and passengers that distracted driving can be avoided, especially for those that are new to driving. Here are a few tips to avoid distracted driving:

- **Stay away from your cell phone:** While you are driving, a cell phone should never be utilized as it is illegal in the State of Illinois. If you need to make a call, it is best to pull over safely to the right shoulder of the road. Even hands-free devices can still cause you to miss important visual and audio cues needed to avoid a crash.
- **If you are drowsy, pull off the road:** Drowsiness increases the risk of a crash by nearly four times. A government study showed that 37 percent of U.S. drivers have nodded off or actually fallen asleep at least once during their driving careers.
- **Limit the number of passengers, as well as the level of activity inside the car:** Especially for teenage drivers, limit the number of passengers within vehicles. Driving with friends can create a dangerous driving environment because novice drivers are focused on their friends rather than the road. Have a discussion with your new driver about limiting distractions.
- **Avoid eating while driving:** Food spills are a major cause of distraction and distracted driving. Decrease your risk of accident by not eating while driving.
- **Do your multi-tasking outside the car:** Everyone spends a lot of time in their vehicles, and it is important to focus on the road and the drivers around you. Prior to traveling, get everything settled to decrease your chance of distraction.

Drivers who are distracted and fail to focus their full attention on the road are the leading cause of most crashes according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Keep yourselves and others safe by remaining alert, and free of distractions.

VEHICLE LICENSE FEES

The new Vehicle License Fee program will be going into its second year in May and June of 2019. Fees are charged at a rate of \$25 per residence or business, and are included on May and June utility statements depending on the location of the residence.

The new program made it so that there is no need to pay additional fees for multiple vehicles, and residents no longer have to receive or display a vehicle sticker.

An exemption is allowed for residents who do not have a vehicle registered to their residence during the year. If you feel that the exemption applies, you may fill out a Vehicle Sticker Exemption Application, which is available at Village Hall or on the Village website at <https://www.foxlake.org/105/Applications-Forms>.

Exemption forms for 2019 will start being accepted by the Village Office after charges appear on the utility billing statements. If exemption applications are approved, a subsequent credit will be made to your account.

Please remember that an exemption form must be submitted annually for your exemption to carry through to current year.

BICYCLE SAFETY

With warmer weather approaching, the Fox Lake Police Department has provided some tips for bicycle safety.

As required by the Illinois Vehicle Code, bicycles traveling on the roadway are vehicles and have all of the rights and responsibilities as motor vehicles. Bicycles are required to drive in the same direction as traffic. Bicyclists are expected to ride single file and to the far right of the roadway except when turning left they may use the left lane. When a bicyclist is continuing forward at intersections with a right turn lane then bicyclist should continue in the through lane.

When driving in the roadway, bicyclists are required to obey street signs and signals and must signal their turns, lane changes, and stops. Bicycles may not be used to carry more passengers than it was designed to transport. Bicyclist must have one hand on the handlebars at all times and should not carry any items that would prevent them from using both hands.

At night, bicycles are required to have at a minimum a front headlight and a rear reflector. Contrasting and reflective clothing is preferred when riding at night for added visibility.

Motor vehicle operators must yield to bicycles as they would any other car on the roadway. In addition, when passing a bicycle, a motorist must provide at least 3 feet between the vehicle and bicycle. If a bicycle is maintaining the speed limit motorist should not pass the bicycle. When passing, the vehicle should slow down, pass on the left and again provide at least 3 feet gap between the two. If they cannot allow at least 3 feet between the bicycle and motor vehicle, they should not pass.

Some cyclists may use the sidewalk or pathway. When riding on the sidewalk, bicyclists are treated as pedestrians and are given the same expectations. Bicycles approaching walking pedestrians should call out to the walkers, advise their intention to pass, and when safe to do so, pass the walkers on the left.

Additional safety precautions to consider include ensuring the bicycle is a proper fit for the rider, and the rider has a properly fitted helmet that is correctly secured. Wearing bright clothing during the day and contrasting/reflective clothing at night will allow for riders to be seen more easily by the motorists sharing the roadway.

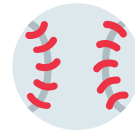

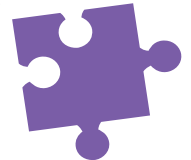

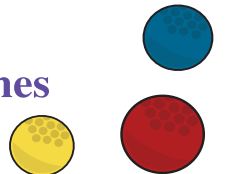
