From the desk of the Mayor...



I hope everyone is enjoying summer and even though it's on a limited basis, we continue to enjoy our beautiful town, the lakes, our neighbors and the many treasures that make this one of the best places on earth to live and raise a family.

With that being said, we are in the midst of a country-wide pandemic. Normally, when there is a natural disaster, like a tornado or flood, there usually is not any debate about whether it is or isn't real. That is not the case with COVID-19. I haven't seen our country this divided since the Vietnam war era. When it comes to the COVID issue, it seems like it has gone from a scientific, medical issue to a political one.

In order to keep our employees safe, and still provide all the essential services our residents rely on, the Village Hall is closed to the public and meetings are held virtually. Village Board meetings are the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month at 6:30 P.M. You can find the link to the Village Board meeting agenda on the Village website on the Friday afternoon prior to each meeting. Public comment is always allowed and encouraged. All permits are still required and the Community Development Department is fully operational. Call or contact us online and we will assist you.

I receive many calls about the recovery phases. For every call I get saying that this is a "spamdemic" and to defy the Governor and open all the businesses, as businesses cannot survive and people are going to lose their houses, I get an equal number of calls asking me "What is the hurry to open businesses? Don't you realize that people are going to die? What does a month or two matter at this point?" The calls always end with the caller asking me to take leadership and support their position.

My position has not and will not change. I took an oath to uphold the constitution of the State of Illinois when I took my oath of office. I have a duty to uphold the laws of the State, not a duty to decide which ones I like or agree with and uphold those laws, but to not enforce the laws I disagree with.

FROM THE DESK OF THE MAYOR

CONTINUED...

I consulted with the Illinois Municipal League, which has an extensive legal team and represents over 1,200 communities in the state of Illinois and received the following guidance:

It is recommended that all communities comply with the Governor's executive orders for the protection of their residents throughout this public health crisis. If a municipality wishes to deviate from the executive orders, municipal officials should consult with their legal counsel or retained attorney prior to taking any formal or informal action that would conflict with the executive orders, as that could create liability exposure to the municipal government or those municipal officials.

I had our administrator check if we would be covered by our insurance if someone caught corona at an event or at a business that we allowed to operate in violation of the Shelter in Place Order and there was a class action suit in which we were named. The insurance company said we would not be covered and they would not defend us. Our reserves could be wiped out quickly in a law suit. I never want to put Fox Lake in a precarious position. Our reserves could be depleted quickly if we were in a suit where we had no insurance.

On a personnel level, I wear a mask. I wear it in public when I shop or walk to a table in a restaurant or anytime, I cannot maintain a safe social distance. I do it, not for myself, but to protect others. My wife is battling cancer, after his two tours of duty in Iraq, my disabled veteran son is in poor health and my granddaughter and daughter who both live with me both have immune deficiencies. While I do not like wearing a mask, I could not live with it if I were the reason that one of my loved ones or anyone else became ill or worse because I did not do something as simple as wear a mask in public.

Reluctantly, we had to cancel many of the activities and events that are summertime staples that I have volunteered for, participated in, and look forward to each year. Our youth programs, fireworks, cardboard boat races, triathlon, Bloody Mary Fest, summer concert series, fishing derby and fish fry and many other programs had to be canceled. There were two deciding factors. First and foremost was the safety of our residents. There will be opportunities to have these events in the future and we will restore these events when it is safe to do so. The other factor in the decision is that the Village would be at risk legally and financially if we defied the "Shelter in Place Order" and "Recovery Phases" mandated by the state.

It seems as if we are bombarded with medical and financial information about the "virus" and it is difficult discerning what is real and what is not. There are many business and municipal funding opportunities from the Federal, State and County. We share this information with our businesses and encourage them to take advantage of these opportunities. Some of the applications are intimidating and if you need help navigating through the forms, contact us, if we cannot help, we will direct you to help.

Our staff is working to acquire the municipal assistance from the Federal, State and County governments. We have applied for over \$12 million in grants. While we will not be able to repair roads in our neighborhoods, we were able to receive funding for Nippersink Boulevard and will complete that project this year.

As we always do, we come together as a community during trying times. This is what I am most proud of when I talk about Fox Lake. We help each other during times of need. Many donations of funds, food and volunteer hours have been made by our residents and businesses. If you wish to volunteer or make a donation, contact me or the Village Hall and we will direct you to those in need.

Ray Scarpelli and the Ray Group

This quarter's Anchor Award goes to Ray Scarpelli and the Ray Group for their generosity to the Fox Lake Community.

Ray Chevrolet was established in 1991 by Ray Scarpelli Jr and his father Ray Sr. beginning with a two-car showroom and about 20 employees. The Ray Auto Group now consists of two stores Ray Chevrolet and Ray Chrysler Dodge Jeep Ram, employing more than 130 people.

Ray and his family's work in the community by supporting numerous organizations including the Big Play Program donating over \$300,000 thus far to local high schools. In addition, Ray hosts the annual "Kids Christmas Party" in which the kids receive gifts and a shopping spree with the Fox Lake Police and Fire Department.

Ray supports local food drives and has helped Catholic Charities raise more than \$80,000. Every year Ray Auto Group holds a "BBQ for the troops" event supporting families of fallen soldiers as well as soldiers that are in need of any assistance. Thus far the dealership has raised over \$90,000 for military families. Ray Chevrolet is a four-time Dealer of the Year recipient thanks in large part to their loyal customers and dedicated staff. This is General Motors most prestigious dealership award.

Ray and his wife Lisa have two children, Ray and Samantha. Their son Ray, a third generation Scarpelli is working alongside his father in the automobile business.

The Village of Fox Lake launched the Village's new Mobile App that is now available on the App Store - Apple and Google Play.


The Village of Fox Lake Mobile App was developed in-house and provides one-stop access to Village news, payment portals, upcoming event information, social media, business directory and more.

MILLENNIUM PARK CONSTRUCTION



The Village was awarded a grant by Lake County Storm Water Management for improvements at Millennium Park near Grand Avenue and Rollins Road. The grant allows us to make enhancements to the park and remove invasive species from the existing wetland area. Other improvements include the installation of a permeable walking path that connects the existing Chain O Lakes bike path to the park's green area, two new bridges that span the waterway, and permeable brick pavers.

Recently the invasive species was mitigated and we expect it to be removed in the coming weeks, it is the Village's goal to eradicate the invasive species during this project. In addition to cleaning up the wetland area, Public Works staff has been working on installing decking on the bridges for aesthetic and safety purposes. The overall goal of this project was to improve the park, and the wetlands, while promoting sustainable infrastructure throughout town.

We expect the project to be completed in the coming weeks, bringing another area in town to enjoy for years to come.

BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS

Community Development has seen an increase in building permit applications from January through July of this year compared to the same months in 2019. We attribute this to the amount of residents who are at home during the COVID-19 pandemic and working on their honey-do lists. We've also found an increase in work being done without the necessary permits. Several residents have stated they heard Village Hall was closed and permits were unable to be obtained. Fortunately, each department has not stopped serving you, and Community Development is still here to assist you with your projects.

The process has changed while our office is closed to the public, but we are here to answer your questions and guide you through the electronic permit process. If you don't have access to a computer or printer we can deliver permit applications to you while our inspectors are in the field. Village Hall has a drop box located near the front door where residents and contractors can drop off their paperwork. Our building inspector is taking every precaution necessary while inspecting work on the interior of homes. Facemasks, shoe coverings, and gloves are worn during the inspection and hand sanitizer is used before and after the inspection. Permit applications and information on the types of work requiring a permit can be found on the Village's website by clicking the "Applications and Forms" tab on the front page or by visiting the department's webpage. We look forward to serving you!

IDENTITY THEFT SCAM ALERT

Did you receive a debit card from the Illinois Department of Employment Security (IDES) in the mail, but you did not file for IDES benefits? It's very likely a scam! The Fox Lake Police Department and the surrounding communities have recently taken several reports of Identity Theft regarding individuals who did not apply for unemployment through the state, but received benefit claim information.

If you receive a letter and/or debit card from IDES without filing, residents are encouraged to:

- DO NOT use the card or call the number and provide personal information
- Monitor your credit
- Report to IDES under Reporting Unemployment Insurance
- File a police report if your identity has been stolen

Due to COVID-19 Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion are now offering free weekly online reports through www.annualcreditreport.com until April 30, 2021.

Make sure you review your credit report carefully for anything unusual or credit cards you did not apply for. If you find you are a victim of identity theft, make sure you file a police report with your local police.

SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

The Department of Homeland Security and the Village of Fox Lake Police Department are reminding residents to "see something, say something."

If you see illegal or suspicious activity, please report to the Village of Fox Lake Police Department directly. As a reminder, do not report suspicious activity through websites, or email as they are not as frequently monitored as emergency phone lines.

To report suspicious activity, contact the Village of Fox Lake Police Department by calling 9-1-1. To assist local officers, describe specifically what you observed including:

- **Who** or **what** you saw;
- **When** you saw it;
- **Where** it occurred; and
- **Why** it's suspicious.

LEAF BURNING

Leaves may be burned on private property between the period of April 1st to June 1st and September 1st to December 1st, each year. Burning of leaves must be at least 30' from any structure. Please have a garden hose or other means to extinguish the fire within close proximity.

As a courtesy to your neighbors, only burn leaves on days when the wind won't affect neighboring properties. A better solution for fall leaves is to shred them and use them as mulch around your garden beds and trees. They decompose into rich and natural fertilizer for your gardens and trees and worms love shredded leaves.

SUMMER WATER SAVING TIPS

Summer can increase a typical family's freshwater use by almost 100%.

Here are several tips to reduce your summer water use for lawn and garden maintenance:

- **Irrigate at Night:** Watering your lawn at night or during the early morning hours can reduce evaporation up to 30% or more, depending on your location.
- **Avoid High Wind Watering:** High winds can evaporate water or blow it away from the target zone; this lowers your sprinkler's efficiency and wastes water.
- **Don't Over Water Your Lawn:** Your yard only needs about an inch of water per week to stay healthy, established gardens require a little less. Watering infrequently but deeply will inhibit a deep root growth, keeping your lawn viable for years to come. Over watering has been linked to pesticide and fertilizers being introduced into streams and rivers so avoidance is the best practice all around.
- **Use Rain Barrels:** Capture the naturally occurring rain and store it for use in your garden or yard. Many systems can be hooked right up to your sprinklers using solar or traditional powered pumps.
- **Don't Water the Street:** Thousands of gallons of water are wasted each day in neighborhoods and homes that have improperly positioned sprinkler heads. Take special care to make sure your sprinkler heads and hoses put the water where it is really needed.

2020 CENSUS INFORMATION

The Village of Fox Lake is reminding everyone to complete the 2020 Census via online, phone, or by mail! If you do not complete the US Census, a Census worker will be coming to your home to assist you in completing.

The Census is crucial for local communities like Fox Lake. Some examples of programs that are determined by Census results include:

- Roadway and Infrastructure funding for local communities
- National School Lunch Program, which helps feed many Fox Lake school children
- Senior Programs and aid for local seniors
- Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant Programs
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
- Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program

Many Fox Lake residents currently utilize and rely on a variety of the programs above. Each counted person provides approximately \$1,500 for their local communities through these programs each year.

COVID-19 General Prevention

Protect yourself from all infectious diseases by using these precautions.

BILL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

BILL PAYMENT ASSISTANCE FOR INCOME ELIGIBLE CUSTOMERS

As the economy reopens, ComEd recognizes you may be experiencing financial hardship, so we are offering additional bill assistance to help you pay your energy bill.

PROGRAM DETAILS

The ComEd Bill Payment Assistance Program helps income eligible customers who are past-due on their energy bills.

- Eligible customers can receive a one-time bill assistance credit of up to \$500 for past-due balances, up to the amount of the balance.
- Available only for a limited time! The Bill Payment Assistance Program expires on 12/31/2020 or until funds are exhausted, whichever comes first.
- Funds are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

ELIGIBILITY

Residential customers who are eligible to receive Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) benefits:

- must have received a LIHEAP grant after October 1, 2019; **and**
- must currently have a past-due balance on their ComEd account.

OR

Residential customers who are income eligible but not LIHEAP approved:

- must complete an application form, which includes verification that they are income qualified (household income of 200% or less of Federal Poverty Level (FPL)); **and**
- must currently have a past-due balance on their ComEd account.
