

From the desk of the Mayor



We are nearing the end of summer, and I would like to reflect on some of our recent accomplishments, upcoming projects, and goals for the future.

As you will read more about in the public works section, many important village projects were recently completed. The Nippersink Road Reconstruction Project which included sewer and water improvements, a new road, bike trail and increased parking was named as the 2022 Lake Branch Project of the Year Award from the American Public Works Association. The project was primarily funded through grants. While it was a shame to see the old Fox Lake sign removed, it was damaged beyond repair. The new sign is something that we as a Village can all be proud of.

You will also read about the completion of the Interconnect Project. The village had been running two separate sewer and water systems. Not only was this costly and inefficient, but a major upgrade was mandated by the EPA for the northern sewer system on Grass Lake Road. Rather than upgrading to a new sewer system, we were able to combine the two sewer and water systems into one fully-functioning system, and at a much lower cost. This project resulted in a more reliable service to our residents and a cost savings of over \$100,000 per year in operating fees.

Concerning upcoming projects, the Lakefront Park enhancement, Knollwood Subdivision flood control and street reconstruction, Washington Street reconstruction, and planning for many other projects is underway.

We held a public meeting and conducted a survey to solicit feedback from residents about which types of amenities they would like to see at Lakefront Park. Over 300 responses were received. A public beach, public pier, riverwalk, enhanced playground equipment, options for additional activities and a band shell were the most requested features. The final plans, including feedback from residents and stakeholders, are being completed and construction will begin this fall.

Knollwood Subdivision has suffered from flooding for many decades. During a flood event, emergency access, mail, food and medical deliveries, school bus service and garbage pick-up are impossible. In many cases residents cannot even leave their homes. I am happy to share that the village received grant funding, and the roads will be reconstructed this year, allowing access for residents and services even during a flood event.

The Washington Street reconstruction project is designed to alleviate the traffic delays at the high school, and includes traffic lights, sidewalks, a bike trail, street lights and storm water improvements. This is a joint project with the Lake County Highway Department and the Village of Fox Lake. The project was originally slated for completion this year, but will pick up next year. Lake County was to receive a portion of their funding through the federal government, due to a delay in receipt of the funding the timeline was pushed back. It appears that the funding is now in place, and the project will resume next year.

Development is essential to the village. Development comes in many forms such as tourism, new businesses, and housing. When a developer approaches the village, in addition to job creation, tax revenues, and leakage (a term to describe goods or services our residents have to go to another town to purchase or receive), we look at the overall impact the potential business will have within our community.

If we can increase revenues through development, we can provide greater goods and services to our residents without raising taxes or fees. For example, in order to meet the needs of our sewer and water system, each year there has been a cost of living plus two percent increase in the sewer and water fees. With the addition of more than 120 homes over the last few years, the increased revenue from the new homes will allow us to forego the annual increase in sewer and water fees beginning next year.

While new development is critical for the village, a thorough review of both short-term and long-term impacts that the development may have within the community is necessary. Another example: a high density housing project may provide a one-time revenue stream through issued building permits and associated fees, but may not be a good fit for the village and could potentially cost the village in the long run. A project may only be approved after individual review, as well as a public hearing via the Planning and Zoning Board and Village Board. Members of both boards recognize the responsibility of serving the village in this capacity, and take this role very seriously.

Tanya Hill named next recipient of village anchor award



Tanya Hill was named the next recipient of the Anchor Award for her outstanding community service and volunteerism. The award presentation takes place at the village board meeting on Tuesday, September 13, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. Tanya serves the community in a variety of ways. She organizes a Thanksgiving meal for individuals who would otherwise spend Thanksgiving alone. This year will be her third year. The initiative had such a positive response that she coordinated an Easter meal with the assistance of Grant Township in April. Each event fed 50-60 individuals. Tanya also volunteers for the Northern Illinois Food Bank twice a week,

and distributes food in town in front of Extra Space Storage. She partners with Grant Township to assist residents who are unable to drive with transportation to and from appointments as well. In addition to coordinating meals and distributing food, Tanya organized the group, Fox Lake Shines, an initiative under Promote Fox Lake, in which she enlists the help of volunteers to collect litter throughout the village. Her goal is to host a minimum of one collection per week, lasting at least one hour.

Several village streets slated for reconstruction

The village is currently in the design phase of reconstructing several roadways. The 2022 Roadway Improvement Project includes a water main replacement on Lincoln Avenue, a water main extension on Garfield Road, and the rehabilitation of Lakeside Lane, Glenview Place, Lincoln Avenue, Garfield Road, Jefferson Street, and Adams Street. In 2019, a roadway inventory was completed and rated these streets a 2/10, which indicates poor condition due to drainage issues, cracking, potholes, and rutting. There have been several water main breaks along these roadways over the last five years, making the replacement of the water main on Lincoln Avenue and Garfield Road a necessity. We will share construction information as it becomes available.

Award-winning Nippersink Boulevard project now complete

The Village of Fox Lake received the Lake Branch Project of the Year Award from the American Public Works Association for the Nippersink Boulevard Reconstruction Project. This project took three years beginning with the installation of a new water and sewer main. The construction also included new storm sewers, fresh hot-mix asphalt and roadway base, sidewalks, lighting, bike lanes, and a retaining wall displaying the village name and logo. These improvements enhance the downtown corridor and promote both walkability and bikeability throughout downtown leading into our Lakefront Park.



Interconnect project provides a long-term, reliable water resource to the village



The Interconnect Project is one of the largest infrastructure improvements in the village's history.

For decades, the village operated two separate water and sewer systems, resulting in increased regulations and operational concerns. In 2014, the village planned to combine both systems. The combined design was complex because the systems crossed and connected beneath the lakes creating one village system. The project was designed and permitted by several regulatory branches including the Army Corp of Engineers, Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR), and Lake County, Illinois Division of Transportation (IDOT). The project included the installation of several thousand feet of pipe and two new lift stations. The village decommissioned an outdated wastewater treatment plant sending the flow to the regional treatment facility off Rollins Road. The Interconnect Project is a long-term solution for the village, providing a more reliable water resource for generations to come.

Brush pick-up continues through November

The last brush pick-up of the 2022 season takes place Friday, November 4, 2022. As a reminder, the limbs should be no longer than 6 feet in length, or larger than 6 inches in diameter. All cut ends should be facing the street with the pile stacked neatly at the
